COVID Exposure Control Plan

1. Physical Distancing of at least 2 meters

- Start/Finish times will be staggered so that fewer people are on site at any given time.
- There will be designated entrance/exit areas for all sites.
- Field set up will be according to BC Soccer guidelines with players restricted to a quadrant surrounded by a Safety Zone. Coaches will be outside that safety zone in space of their own.
- Parents will be encouraged to drop their children off at the site and then leave the area. Those having to stay will be required to physical distance according to Public Health Orders.

2. Frequent Hand Washing

- Registration information will include instructions that will require all participants to thoroughly wash their hands prior to coming to the field
- All registrants will be required to use the provided hand sanitizers at the entrance to the field.
- All registrants will be required to use the provided hand sanitizers as they exit the field.

3. Users will sanitize their own equipment and do so with their own cleaning supplies.

- ASA Staff will clean and sanitize all equipment prior to each session and again following each session. There is a 15 minutes time frame between each session to allow for cleaning and sanitizing all equipment.

4. Confirmation of adherence to facility use area maximum participant count for space being used.

- Registration for programs will be set up to allow a maximum of 40 participants and coaches per session.

5. Process for advising participants in advance about personal health and addressing individuals exhibiting signs of illness on site.

- Every registrant will be made of aware of, and have to provide, a Daily Health Assessment Form.
 - This form will be presented at the entrance to each site, every day, to ensure all participants are healthy and have not exhibited signs of any COVID symptoms.
 - Should a participant be exhibiting signs of illness prior to entering the field, they will not be permitted to participate and will be required to leave the site immediately.
 - Should a participant show signs of illness during a session, they will be removed to a designated area to wait for their parents to take them home.
- 6. Procedures for managing equipment needs for participants to avoid sharing of items**
- All participants will be using a club soccer ball that has been sanitized prior to and following each session
 - There will be an emphasis on no 'handling' of the ball, just a focus on footwork.
- 7. Evidence of communications to employees, volunteers, and participants to reinforce safety control measures.**
- Each registration will include a check box indicating that all families are aware of the guidelines under which we are operating.
 - The Technical Director has communicated directly with all coaches regarding expectations and responsibilities.

- 8. Evidence of training for individuals leading or supporting activities, per industry requirements. New coaching/instructor guidelines.**

- 9. Updated procedures for first aid, medical assistance, PPE supplies, and protocol response to cases or outbreaks.**
- All coaching staff will be provided with non-medical facemasks for minor emergent situations.
 - The club has first aid equipment at the site to deal with minor issues, an ambulance would be called for any major injuries.
 - Should an outbreak occur during the course of the program, all participants would be informed of such and the ASA would follow the guidance of the local Public Health Authority regarding whether or not the program would continue.
 - Daily attendance will help in tracing cases.
